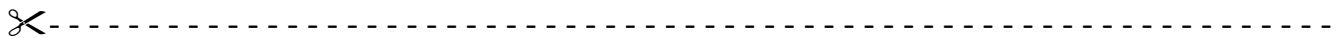
Registration Fee
