RAINN: stands for (Rape, Abuse, and Incest National Network) and they are the nation's largest anti-sexual violence organization. They operate the National Sexual Assault Hotline that I have listed where you can call from anywhere free of charge and they will link you up with service providers in your area. They partner with more than 1,000 local sexual assault service providers across the U.S. and they operate the DoD Safe Helpline for the U.S. Department of Defense. They also do public education programming to prevent sexual violence, help survivors, and they have policy teams lobbying at the federal and state levels to improve the criminal justice system, preventing sexual assault and ensuring that perpetrators are brought to justice. They lead the national effort to end the rape kit backlog and work closely with the Department of Justice, Education, and Health and Human Services to improve federal response to sexual violence.
